

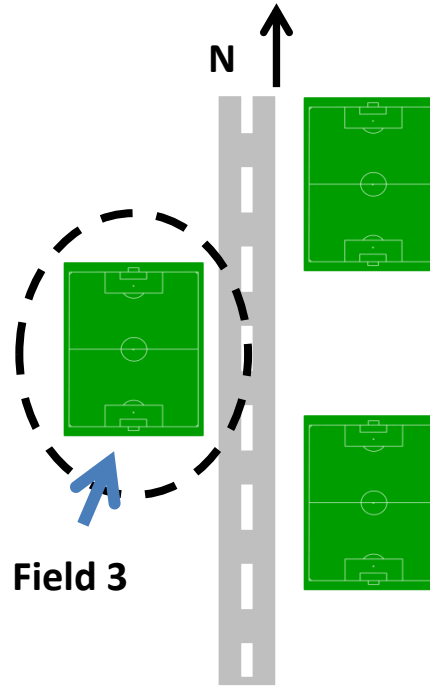
## Present & Past Community Collaboration:

# FUNDING PROPOSAL

## West Field Lighting Project

## WHY WE NEED A SECOND LIGHTED FIELD:

Warrenton Soccer Complex...

- It's an ongoing labor of love.
- MANY individuals and businesses have come together to donate time and money to make some of the best soccer fields in the state, right in our backyard.
- It's for the community, by the community.
- **Only one field is lighted.**
- Fields are now seeing greatly increased scheduling conflicts during the Fall Recreational and Classic seasons, our peak use time.
- This not only is a scheduling problem, but creates much greater wear and tear on the grass fields, which increases the time and costs associated with the extra field maintenance. Again, this maintenance is all by volunteers.
- **Having a second lighted field will directly address these problems and give us expansion capacity for years to come.**

## PROPOSAL:

- Install lights on Field 3 (West Field)

### Estimated Cost:

- MATERIALS — \$55,000 - \$56,000 (MUSCO lights and components)
- INSTALLATION — \$80,000 (LCYSA & volunteer contribution)

### Secured Funding:

- Oregon Community Foundation grant — \$16,000
- LCYSA — \$16,000

### Needed Funding:

- **We still need \$25,000+**



## HISTORY OF THE COMPLEX:

- 1990 — Field 1 and parking lot completed
- 1991 — Tractor shed and concessions bldgs. completed
- 1992 — Field 2 and parking lot completed
- 1994 — Player shelters built first time
- 2002 — Field 3 and parking lot completed; first gang mower purchased
- 2000 — Lights installed on Field 2
- 2003 — Irrigation well installed (~3.5 million gallons/year)
- 2004 — First electronic scoreboard
- 1994 — Player shelters on Field 2
- 2004 — Field 3 player shelters built
- 2005 — Field 2 player shelters rebuilt
- 2007 — Chain link fencing replaced all previous fencing
- 2008 — New electronic scoreboard
- 2009 — Field 1 player shelters built
- 2010 — Field 2 begins new drainage improvement project; tractor purchased

Goal frames and nets have been upgraded several times over the years. Other continual upgrades have been necessary: Gator riding tractor, top dressers, aerators, fertilizer spreaders, compressors, field painters, etc.
